#### Field of Honor Color Guard Event

#### Gentlemen,

The Exchange Club of Newport Harbor requests the CASSR Color Guard present the Colors during the opening ceremonies at 10:00 am, Friday, May 17th. There will be a large contingent of elementary and middle school children at the Friday event.

If you are able to attend please be at Castaways Park no later than 9:15 am for briefing and a walk through. We'll gather at the Castaways Park parking lot. We will be positioned near the focal point of the event so marching will not be necessary. We can walk to the war memorial at Upper Castaways Park.

Saturday the CASSAR Color Guard will march a short distance (50 yards or less) with a fife and drum corp and a USMC Color Guard. After the short march we will form a cordon for the Marine Corps Color Guard to march through enroute to present the Colors.



The Gold Country Chapter Sons of the American Revolution Minutes of the March 16th, 2013 Meeting At Lou La Bonte's Restaurant, Auburn

President Dale Ross called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

The invocation was given by Barry Hopkins.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Dick Fowler.

The SAR Pledge was led by Alan Brooking.

In attendance were thirteen members and five guests.

Guests were asked to introduce themselves. Ron Barker introduced a new member, Phillip Cameron.

The DAR members from the Captain John Oldham Chapter were Coreena Ross, Patricia Hopkins, and Mary Dancer.

Motion to approve the minutes of the February 16th, 2013 meeting minutes as published on the chapter website was made by Greg Hill and seconded by Mike Holmes. It passed by voice vote.

#### **Reports:**

**President's report -** Dale Ross asked the chapter to cover the expense of his president's ribbon. Ron Barker said that Dale had the authority to use the funds in his President's Fund as stated in the budget. Dale would like to see us continue to sell pins and flags at future events. Ernie McPherson said he has already reordered some of those items.

**First Vice President -** Michael Homes: No report, but did ask about when we would be sending the collected donations to the Touch of Home program. Dave Gilliard said it takes about two meetings to collect at least \$100 and that he would expect to send them a check every other month. Before today's meeting we had collected \$52. Dave said a check will be sent within a week.

Second Vice President - Ron Barker: The issue of the chapter paying the Ladies Auxiliary Dues was discussed during our last meeting and he asked for Keith to give an up-date to what the state needs. Keith said there was some confusion the last time because no names were submitted with the dues. This time we need to attach the members names. Ron made a motion to have the chapter pay the Ladies Auxiliary Dues, seconded by Keith Bigbee, and passed by voice vote. California State President, Keith Bigbee, clarified that the state will need a list of the women in the auxiliary when the dues are paid. He will take care of paying the Ladies Auxiliary Dues when he is at the April meeting in Ventura.

**Secretary -** Michel Howell: no report.

Treasurer's report - David Gilliard: There is \$3,492 in checking and \$14,002 in the Vanguard account. Dave then asked every one to review the proposed budget and mentioned that is was worked on by a committee after our last chapter meeting in February. After a few clarifying questions were asked, Dave Gilliard moved to approve the budget, Ron Barker seconded, and the motion was passed by voice vote. Point of Order was brought up that Dave should not have been the one to make the motion; so Keith Bigbee also moved to approve the budget.

Registrar/Genealogist/Membership - Ron Barker: One new member was present, Phillip Cameron. One additional new member, Lew Osteen, could not make it today. One more application is at national to be processed. Three supplemental patriot ancestors were approved and two more are at national. Recruiting of new members was briefly discussed and Mike Holmes said he would contact Dave Perkins at Sun City to announce our chapter meetings. Mike also said he would again try to get an announcement of our meetings into the Auburn Journal.

**Historian/Chaplain -** Barry Hopkins: No report was given. He was asked to bring in our scrap books for the members to review.

#### **Programs:**

**JROTC** - Michael Holmes: No report.

Color Guard - Michael Howell: Next event is Patriots Day on Friday, April 19th , 2013 from 11 am to 1 pm in Old Town Auburn. Michael asked for volunteers and Keith Bigbee, David Gilliard, Dale Ross, Donn Dancer, and Ron Barker volunteered. It was suggested that the clubs banner be brought and that it would need a stand. Michael and Dale said they would make a stand.

The next events will be 4th of July parades typically one on the 3rd and one on the 4th. Michael will set these up.

**Eagle Scout -** Dale Ross: We have made a connection with the local Boy Scout office and expect to receive a few names in the near future. If the connection goes

through there will be a lot of names for the Eagle Scout Program.

**Newsletter Editor -** Donn Dancer: No report was given. A request was made for submissions from member trips that deal with topics relative to the Revolutionary War.

Webmaster - Gregory Hill: No report was given.

**Valley Forge Teacher -** Michael Holmes: One perspective teacher for the next year.

**Poster Contest -** David Gilliard: Last weekend the first round of poster judging was held with 531 posters submitted from 25 classes. He thanked those who assisted. Today is the final judging.

**Old Business**: No report was given.
